

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

### **EASY CHICKEN POT PIE**

### **Ingredients**

- <sup>2</sup>/<sub>3</sub> cup frozen mixed vegetables, thawed
- 1 cup cooked chicken, cut into bite-size pieces
- 1 (10<sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub> ounce) can low fat, condensed, cream of chicken soup
- 1 cup baking mix
- ½ cup skim milk
- 1 egg



- 1. Wash hands and any cooking surfaces.
- 2. Pre-heat oven to 400 degrees F.
- 3. Mix vegetables, chicken and soup in ungreased, 9-inch pie plate
- 4. Stir baking mix, milk and egg in a mixing bowl with fork until blended. Pour over vegetables, chicken and soup mixture in pie plate.
- 5. Bake 30 minutes or until golden brown.
- 6. Let cool 5 minutes and serve.
