





FORAGE TIMELY TIPS

- 1. Continue feeding hay until adequate forage exists in the pasture for grazing.
- 2. Spring seeding of grasses should be done in early to mid-March (but fall is preferred).
- 3. Provide free choice high-magnesium mineral to prevent grass tetany on lush spring growth.
- 4. Begin smoothing or re-seeding hay feeding and heavy traffic areas.



SUPPORTING YOUR LOCAL 4-H AND FFA.

In 2023, Washington County raised \$2,130 through the Ag Tag Voluntary Donation program. That's money that goes directly to Kentucky 4-H, Kentucky FFA and Kentucky Proud to support our agriculture community (and its future) here locally and across the Commonwealth.

Of that money, \$710 went to the Washington County 4-H Program to support local activities. We have over 300 4-H members participating in activities like 4-H Camp, Horse Club, Livestock Club, Shooting Sports, Sewing Club, and Cooking Club.

ASIAN SALAD DRESSING

- ¹/₂ teaspoon garlic powder


Directions:
